Seaver Woolfolk is the continuous improvement and safety coordinator for Super Radiator Coils, located in Richmond, VA. Super Radiator Coils is a 90,000 Sq. Ft. industrial manufacturing facility with an average of 120 employees. Seaver is responsible for all continuous improvement activities and projects. The scope of his work has progressed from not only Five "S" related activities, but also production flow improvement and material usage. Seaver also has the responsibility of the facility's safety program, in which he started and created. Super Radiator Coils has experienced the longest streak of non-recordable injuries (173,500 working hours) along with the lowest number of recordable injuries per year (3) in the Richmond facility's history.

He began his schooling program in 2004 while working for Target Cooperation. He was the backroom logistics lead for 2 years until he moved on to Super Radiator Coils in 2006. During the most recent 3 years, Seaver has been an active member of VBEC. He has worked with Keith Hornburger (VMA), GENEDGE and most recently Trevor Bosen (previous VBEC events chair). Through all of these experiences, Seaver has learned a wealth of knowledge about not only manufacturing, lean and safety, but about relationships and people.
